<i>Acacia implexa</i>	Lightwood	Fast growing, attractive upright small tree, perfumed cream balls summer. Well drained
<i>Acacia mearnsii</i>	Black Wattle	Quick growing, large, open spreading tree, pale yellow balls spring. Moist - well drained
<i>Acacia melanoxylon</i>	Blackwood	Hardy screening tree, pale yellow flowers late Win, 10-15m x 2-5m. Tolerant, long-lived
<i>Acacia pycnantha</i>	Golden Wattle	Upright small tree < 8 x 2-3m. Australia's Floral Emblem. Attractive, Well-drained sites
<i>Allocasuarina littoralis</i>	Black Sheoke	Slender open tree to 10 x 2-3m. Attractive bark on mature trees. Well-drained sites
<i>Bedfordia arborescens</i>	Blanket Leaf	Small variable tree requiring shade and moist well drained soil. 3-7m*2-3m wide.
<i>Eucalyptus cephalocarpa</i>	Silver-leaf Stringybark	Dense canopy, medium tree, silvery foliage. Valuable honey tree. Moist well drained
<i>Eucalyptus dives</i>	Broad-Leafed Peppermint	Spreading tree with large canopy. 8-25m*6-15m. Well drained soils.
<i>Eucalyptus goniocalyx</i>	Bundy or Long-leaf Box	Fast growing tree to<20, long leaves, cream flowers Mar-Aug. Dryish, shallow soils
<i>Eucalyptus globoidea</i>	White Stringybark	Upright large shade tree, adaptable. Restricted. Good honey tree. Locally significant
<i>Eucalyptus macrorhyncha</i>	Red Stringybark	Medium upright tree, rounded canopy. Excellent honey tree. Dryish shallow soils
<i>Eucalyptus melliodora</i>	Yellow Box	Attractive, tall, valuable honey & timber tree. Well-drained soils. High branching

<i>Eucalyptus radiata</i>	Narrow-leaf Peppermint	Attractive, scented & weeping canopy, leaves distilled for oil. Well drained. soils
<i>Eucalyptus regnans</i>	Mountain Ash	Tallest flowering plant in the world. 25-95m*15-30m. Full sun, rich moist soil.
<i>Eucalyptus rubida</i>	Candlebark	Upright tree, attractive smooth white trunk. Koala food & honey. W/draind
<i>Eucalyptus viminalis</i>	Manna Gum	Tall, quick growing tree, white trunk, ribbon bark. Koala food. Riparian areas, moist sites.

<i>Bursaria spinosa</i>	Sweet Bursaria	Large shrub, shiny leaves, masses white fragrant flowers Dec-Mar. Butterfly habitat plant
<i>Cassinia aculeata</i>	Dogwood	Open upright shrub, domed heads whitish flowers Nov-Mar. Quick to establish, hardy
<i>Cassinia arcuata</i>	Drooping Cassinia	Open weeping shrub to 3m, pale brown flowerheads summer. Dryish sites
<i>Cassinia longifolia</i>	Shiny Cassinia	Shrub 2-4m, some moisture. White clustered flowers Dec-Mar.
<i>Coprosma quadrifida</i>	Prickly Currant Bush	Small red edible berries summer. Shrub 2-4m, providing good bird habitat. Moist sites

<i>Kunzea ericoides</i>	Burgan	Attractive shrub, masses white flowers Spring. 2-5m. Hardy screening plant, most soils
<i>Leptospermum continentale</i>	Prickly Tea-tree	Hardy upright shrub 2-4m. White flowers spring. Moist to well drained sites. Habitat.
<i>Leptospermum lanigerum</i>	Woolly Tea-tree	Attractive, woolly green-grey foliage, masses white flowers spring. 3-4m. Some moisture
<i>Melaleuca ericifolia</i>	Swamp Paperbark	Moist site, cream brush flowers Summer. Shrub to 4m. May sucker. Screening & habitat
<i>Melaleuca squarrosa</i>	Scented Paperbark	Narrow shrub with triangular shaped leaves, scented brush flowers. 2-4m. Moist sites.
<i>Ozothamnus ferrugineus</i>	Tree Everlasting	To 6 x 3m, terminal clusters whitish flowers Spr-Sum. Screening. Some moisture
<i>Olearia lirata</i>	Showy Daisy-bush	Masses white daisy flowers Spr-Sum. Moist, sheltered sites and riparian 3x2m.
<i>Polyscias sambucifolius</i>	Elderberry Panax	Variable, usually upright shrub. 1-8m*1-3m. Part to full sun in moist well drained soil.
<i>Pomaderris aspera</i>	Hazel Pomaderris	Small leafy tree, masses yellow-green flowers spring. Moist well-drained sites. Screening
<i>Pomanderris prunifolia</i>	Plumb Leaf Pomanderris	1-4m*1-4m. Rounded shrub. Full sun to full shade. Tolerates some dry especially if shaded.
<i>Pomaderris racemosa</i>	Clustered Pomaderris	Narrow, erect shrub, clusters yellow flowers Oct-Nov. Moist to dry well-drained sites
<i>Prostanthera lasianthos</i>	Victorian Christmas Bush	Aromatic foliage, white & pink flowers Dec. 4-6 x 2-4m. Very attractive, well-drained site

<i>Daviesia leptophylla</i>	Slender Bitter-pea	Open erect shrub 1-2m, racemes yellow & red flowers Sep-Jan. Well-drained sites
<i>Derwentia derwentiana</i>	Derwent Speedwell	Straggly open perennial, white flowers Nov-Jan, moist well drained soil.
<i>Goodenia ovata</i>	Hop Goodenia	Fast-growing shrub to 2m, masses yellow flowers Aug-Feb. Hardy. Most soils. Tip prune

<i>Lagenifera stipitata</i>	Blue Bottle Daisy	8 - 25cm high spreading herb, mauve flowers Spring to Autumn
<i>Leptorhynchus tenuifolius</i>	Wiry Buttons	Grassy herb to 30cm, wiry stems, yellow button flowers Oct-Mar. Most soils
<i>Lycopus australis</i>	Australian Gypsywort	Erect, leafy aromatic herb to 1m, tiny white flowers Sum. Moist sites & waterways.
<i>Linum marginale</i>	Native Flax	Slender erect perennial to 80cm, blue flowers Sep-May. Suits most sites. Self-seeding
<i>Lobelia anceps</i>	Angled Lobelia	Prostrate layering herb with blue flowers most of the year. Moist sites
<i>Microseris lanceolata</i>	Yam Daisy	Tufted perennial herb, yellow daisy flowerhead July - Nov, well drained soil.
<i>Myriophyllum crispatum</i>	Water milfoil	Erect perennial herb, cream flowers Oct-April, moist to wet soils.
<i>Oreomyrrhis eriopoda</i>	Hairy Caraway	Rosetted perennial to 30cm high, tiny white flowers Sep-Nov. Self-seeding
<i>Persicaria decipiens</i>	Slender Knotweed	Semi-aquatic spreading herb to 60cm. Spikes pink flowers Sum.
<i>Poranthera microphylla</i>	Small Poranthera	Small trailing annual to 10cm high. White flowers Spring-Summer. Rockery plant
<i>Ranunculus amphitrichus</i>	Small River Buttercup	Perennial herb forming mats. 5cm * Spreading. Full to part sun, moist soil to shallow water.
<i>Ranunculus inundatus</i>	River Buttercup	Perennial herb forming mats. 5-30cm * spreading. Full to part sun, moist soil to shallow water.
<i>Solenogyne dominii</i>	Solenogyne	10cm rosettes with greenish flowerheads. Well-drained soils.

<i>Arthropodium milleflorum</i>	Pale Vanilla Lily	Tufted perennial herb, pale pink or mauve flowers Spr-Sum. Moist to well drained
<i>Arthropodium strictum</i>	Chocolate Lily	Violet flowers on erect stems, spring. Grass-like leaves. Attractive. Reshoots in winter
<i>Bulbine bulbosa</i>	Bulbine Lily	Tufted perennial herb, yellow star-like flowers Sep-Jan. Moist well drained. Reshoots win.
<i>Carex appressa</i>	Tall Sedge	Robust, dense tuft to 1.5m. Moisture. Good bank stabiliser. Riparian sites and ponds
<i>Carex breviculmis</i>	Short Stem Sedge	Small dense tuft. To 15cm tall. Full to part sun, adaptable to most soils.
<i>Carex brownii</i>	Sedge	Loose perennial tuft. Stems to 1m tall. Full to part sun. Moist to wet soil.
<i>Carex fascicularis</i>	Tassel Sedge	Bright green tufted plant to 1m with green tassels from Oct-Apr. Moist and riparian sites
<i>Chionochoa pallida</i>	Red Anther Wallaby Grass	Tufted fine grass, attractive red anthers on long panicles Summer. Dryish, well drained
<i>Cyperus gunnii</i>	Flecked Flat Sedge	Densely tufted perennial. 0.6-1m * Spreading. Full to part sun, moist to wet soils.
<i>Cyperus lucidus</i>	Leafy Flat Sedge	Densely tufted perennial. 0.6-1.5m * Spreading. Part sun, moist soil to shallow water.
<i>Danthonia spp.</i>	Wallaby Grasses	Perennial grasses, tussocky clumps. Hardy. Fluffy seed heads. Many situations
<i>Deyeuxia quadriseta</i>	Reed Bent-grass	Open tufted tussock, attractive in large clumps. Well drained.
<i>Dianella longifolia</i>	Pale Flax-lily	Tufted perennial clump, blue flowers Spr. Blue berries Sum. <1m. Moist to w/draind
<i>Dianella revoluta</i>	Black-anther Flax-lily	Spreading tufted clump, blue flowers Aug-May, dark blue berries. Dryish, well drained
<i>Dianella tasmanica</i>	Tasman Flax-lily	Broad leaved tufted clump, blue flowers, purple berries. <1.5m. Moist to w/draind
<i>Dichelachne micranthe</i>	Short-hair Plume Grass	An ornamental grass to 10 cm high, stems to 1m. Well drained.
<i>Diplarrena moraea</i>	White Butterfly Flag	Attractive tussock-like lily, large single white flowers Oct-Dec. Well drained, rockeries
<i>Eleocharis acuta</i>	Common Spike Rush	Rhizomatous semi-aquatic perennial herb. 0.3-0.9m * Spreading. Full sun, moist soil to shallow water
<i>Eleocharis sphacellata</i>	Tall Spike Rush	Robust perennial aquatic herb. 0.5-2m * Spreading. Full to part sun, wet soil to shallow water
<i>Gahnia sieberiana</i>	Red-fruited Sword-sedge	Large attractive clumping sedge, red nuts. Sword-grass brown butterfly habitat
<i>Isolepis inundata</i>	Swamp Club-rush	5-30cm tufted rush, clusters angled spikelets Oct-Apr. Moist soils, damp sites & riparian
<i>Juncus sp</i>	Rushes	Usually robust tussocks, good habitat for frogs & birds. Moist soils, damp sites & riparian
<i>Lomandra filiformis</i>	Wattle Mat-rush	Rhizomatous tufted herb to 30cm. Well drained, attractive form. Suit rockeries.
